





What is school in Ireland like?

Public school in Ireland is made up of Primary ($1^{st} - 6^{th}$ grade) and Post-Primary ($7^{th} - 12^{th}$ grade) Schools.

Students earn a "Leaving Certificate" by passing a "terminal examination of post-primary education" at the age of 17 or 18.

This is like our high school diploma and final exams.

Almost every Irish student must study and pass Irish Gaelic, as well!
