






CONGRATULATIONS!

As 2016 draws to a close, the time has come for me to give out a few 2016 CnamB President's Awards to deserving members of our local Gaelic games organizations. The physical tokens are being made (at my personal expense, so no need for a fundraiser!), and I will distribute them once they are ready. The awardees are people who, in my opinion and from my vantage point, really brought the best of the Irish sporting tradition and culture to our camogie club as well as to the local Irish community and the greater GAA universe. Congratulations to Riley Smith, Breana Ryan, Donna Looney-McGlynn, Betsy Power, & Andrew Speer, and thank you each for setting such excellent examples for us all!

My husband Edward and I founded Cumann na mBan Camogie Club in the fall of 2014. I was elected CnamB President for 2015 and again for 2016. Edward and I made the decision to form Cumann na mBan Camogie Club based upon several important founding principles:

- 1. To have a club that was dedicated to the sport of camogie, as opposed to "female hurling".
- 2. To form a Gaelic games organization that was committed to supporting and promoting Irish culture in our area in a dignified manner respectful of the GAA heritage.
- 3. To make sure the women's club was completely inclusive of all ages, ethnicities, and fitness/ability levels.
- 4. To create a women's club that was governed entirely separately from the Hampton Roads Hurling Club (HRHC), by women and for women.

5. To maintain a positive and synergistic working relationship with the HRHC based upon mutual respect and equality.

As most of you know, Edward and I had the amazing opportunity to move to Glasgow, Scotland, in late December 2015, and we were there until early August 2016. Prior to that, we were at every Saturday and Tuesday camogie practice for 14 straight months, from CnamB's very first practice on November 1st, 2014, through December 26th, 2015, with the exception of a few weeks when we were in Canada and Ireland. Edward as Bainisteoir (Head Coach) lugged the CnamB stick bag and CnamB helmet bag to every single practice while we were in Virginia. I brought the team banner to most practices and to every tournament CnamB attended and to every fall camogie league match of the 2015 season where I personally made sure it was proudly and visibly displayed.

Those of you who know us, know we love the sports of camogie and hurling. Those of you who were in CnamB in 2014 and/or 2015 know that we devoted countless amounts of time, personal money, energy, talent, blood, sweat, and tears to the creation, expansion, protection, and promotion of CnamB. I personally recruited quite a few camogs and spent large amounts of my practice time working one-on-one with newbies to make sure they learned proper fundamentals. Edward advocated for the camogs and CnamB constantly and also sacrificed his own playing time with the HRHC to coach CnamB in tournaments. We care deeply about CnamB Camogie Club and want it to be worthy of its important Irish name.

Best of luck to the 2017 Bord Cruinn of CnamB. We hope the future has great things in store for the entire club.
