### IRISH SODA BREAD

by Betsy Rivers-Kennedy

Betsy's Irish + Scotch Soda Bread

4 cups King Arthur Flour (can be ± whole wheat)

3 tbls. Sugar

1 tsp. Salt

1 tsp. Baking Powder

±tsp. Baking Soda

4 tbls. Butter

1½ Cups Raisins

1 tsp Carroway Seeds

2 thls. Scotch

2 Eggs

1 Cup Buttermilk

Preheat oven

1. In small bowl míx raisins, Scotch

and carroway seeds

2. Combine Flour, sugar, salt, baking powder and soda in a bowl. Cut or rub in butter until the mixture resembles bread crumbs. Stir in raisin mixture.

3. Beat eggs and stir all but 1ths, to buttermilk Add wet to dry ingredients. Mix till it forms

a ball; place in well greased 8" dish or cake pan.

4. Brush top with remaining egg + 1 tbls. sugar.

5. Cut a 4" cross in top of dough

6. Bake 45 to 50 minutes.
