



Before you turn your nose up at the idea of a pudding shooter, let me assure you that I tried one of the Coconut Cream ones, and it was



absolutely DELICIOUS!!! I do not know where she got the recipes from, but I am very glad she shared them with me, and I am, in turn, sharing them with you. Just mix all ingredients, dollop into plastic shot containers and put caps on, and then place in refrigerator to set. Perhaps in larger portions, they would make a scrumptious adult parfait for your family Easter dinner. The basic recipe is so easy; you could also mix other flavors of pudding and other liqueurs to get other recipes. Enjoy!

Chocolate Fudge Pudding Shots

1 box (3.5 ounce) chocolate fudge instant pudding ½ cup Bailey's Irish Cream ½ cup Kahlua (or Godiva Chocolate liqueur) 1 cup milk

1 tub Cool Whip, thawed

Coconut Cream Pudding Shots

1 box (3.5 ounce) coconut cream instant pudding 1 cup coconut rum 1 cup milk

1 tub Cool Whip, thawed

Orange Creamsicle Shots

1 box (3.5 ounce) vanilla instant pudding 1/8 cup (30 mil) Frangelico

½ cup orange vodka

1 cup milk

1 tub Cool Whip, thawed

My daughters, **Darcie** and **Jamie**, granddaughter, **Em** and I just want to thank everyone for their support once again this year. All donations given go to a wonderful cause towards conquering childhood cancers through funding much needed research.

For this year's event to date the four of us have raised over \$3,000, plus each of the girls donated their hair to either "Pantene beautiful lengths" for adults or "Wigs for Kids" for children. The "Wigs for Kids" organization has since recognized Emmy with a certificate for her donation.



Just raising funds was not enough for little **Ms Em**, just 8-1/2 years old at event date, she also donated her shaved locks of hair to "Wigs for Kids". In the weeks leading up to the event she convinced her mother, **Darcie**, to go all the way to BALD, not just a pixie cut. Em's **Aunt Jamie** was more difficult and held out until shave time. Dad helped out with a challenge that if she'd go all the way that he would give another \$100 to the cause. The room took that and double it so by going all the way Aunt Jamie raise an additional \$207 on the spot. Both Darcie and Jamie's donated hair will be going to "Pantene beautiful lengths" who *create free, real-hair wigs for women with cancer*.

Way to GO ladies, you are strong and brave. Dad is very proud of each of you.

Since going bald my girls have been great ambassadors for St Baldrick's and conquering childhood cancers. They are often asked why they are bald or why they shaved their heads. They have no problem providing insight and answers.



So some of you may be questioning what happened to my three grandsons who last year donated their hair. Well they are on another quest to grow their hair long and donate it again next year. You'll see them in a few of the pictures with their shaggy heads.

At this point I am within reach of raising \$1,500, I just need \$165 more. With the help of our Irish society



members we can easily raise \$85 which would then be matched by the society. \$85 is not the limit, just a goal. You all are the GREATEST!


