BARTENDER'S CHOICE

Just in time for the holiday season, Debra Taylor-Kelly brought this lovely Cranberry Rosemary Prosecco cocktail to my attention! It would make a delightful drink for Thanksgiving, Christmas, or New Year's Eve gatherings! The recipe below is from Better Homes & Gardens, and you can access it at the link at the bottom. I bolded the amount of time you have to freeze the mixture as this is important to keep in mind when you are doing party prep and have time constraints. They say this recipe makes 10 servings, and each is about 97 calories, but who's counting during the holidays?! Cheers!

Cranberry Orange Rosemary Cocktail Ingredients

- 11/2 cups water
- 1 sprig fresh rosemary (5 to 6 inches long) [plus additional sprigs to garnish each glass]
- 2 cups cranberry juice
- 1 cup Triple Sec
- 1 750 milliliter bottle Prosecco, chilled

Directions

- 1. Heat water to boiling in microwave. Add rosemary sprig to water and let steep 10 minutes. Discard rosemary sprig.
- In a 1-quart freezer container, combine cranberry juice, rosemary water, and Triple Sec. Cover and freeze 8 hours or until ready to use.
- 3. To serve, scoop frozen cranberry mixture into champagne flutes, filling about 1/2 full. Top with Prosecco and garnish with sprigs of fresh rosemary.






SUNSHINE NEWS

POETRY CORNER

At the end of October, our much-loved gentle giant Jim Ramsey, USMC (retired), was laid to rest in Arlington **National Cemetery**, where many of our other IAS members, their spouses, or their parents have been interred as well. Veterans Day/Remembrance Day is bittersweet with them gone from our midst. In honor of Veterans Day/ Remembrance Day, I am submitting the following poem written by **Mike Waugh**, a longtime friend of the IAS. Mike and his lovely wife, Trish O'Donnell Jenkins, are the owners of Wild West Irish Tours, and he was kind enough to give a program for the IAS on "The Waters & the Wild -The West of Ireland" at our February 2015 meeting. He gave me permission to submit this poem for our newsletter after I saw it and the accompanying picture posted on his Facebook profile and asked him about it. He wrote the poem about his grandfather. The following introductory information was written by him on Facebook, and the poem was originally published in *The St. Petersburg Times*.

This is LCPL James Henry Waugh, 16 years old, known then as "Young Jimmy Waugh" - my grandfather. He lied about his age so could volunteer to fight in WW I. He was sent to France and Belgium, where he lost his eye in battle to a sniper's bullet a month before the Armistice. He made it home on Christmas Day in 1918. He eventually married Margaret Hassett from County Clare, Ireland. He might not have known this, but his Grandparents, Henry Irwin and Mary Waugh were from County Leitrim, Ireland. They were "Vaugh" when they got on the boat in Ireland. Anyway, Pop was awarded the Purple Heart. I gave him my first Good Conduct Medal before he "looked the reaper in the eye and sang his last goodbye."

I wrote this after a dream aboard ship in 1982 and it was posted in The Saint Petersburg Times.

FOR POP

I'll always remember that certain way he so often used to sit, smoking his pipe in the evening and the first one up in the morning; wearing his tie and that familiar cologne. With only one eye, he'd glance at a world that changed more than he'd care for. That war took his sight but not his insight... His will and desire never compromised. This man from Torey Hill and his bride from County Clare; they say opposites attract, and they did. Together forever, and without many words, and love extended to all of us.

He laughed at my jokes even if they weren't funny. Talking about the Mets and the old days made us smile. Slipped the kids a buck when he could, making sure we all were happy. A man that kept to himself But loved out loud with a purple heart. Standing erect, always in control, we called him the patriarch, the old man, our Pop. On the day he left, he made it quite clear, that he'd leave this world with dignity. While looking the reaper in the eye, he sang his last goodbye: "I did it my way" And Pop, you did.
