

RUM AND RAISIN CAKE (A HOLIDAY FAVORITE!)

Original recipe from **Gertie Best**. Southern Harbour, Newfoundland, Canada **Adapted in tiny ways by her niece, Maureen Cahill**

DIRECTIONS

Combine raisins, currants or chopped dried apricots, and dates. Cover in rum and soak for several hours.

Combine raisins, currants or chopped dried apricots, and dates with sugar, water, butter, and spices in a sauce pan. (If there is any rum that does not soak into the fruit, leave it, and add it later to make the needed $\frac{1}{2}$ cup). Bring to a boil, then reduce heat, and let simmer for 20-30 minutes.

Remove from heat. Stir (or mash) all ingredients and let cool for about an hour. (I prefer stirred, but if you don't want the fruit visible, mash them.)

Preheat oven to 275.

Add rum and vanilla. Mix through, and let stand about 30 minutes.

Add eggs to the wet mixture, and mix well.

Combine flour, baking soda, and baking powder in a separate bowl. (Make sure baking soda and powder are fresh, and stir all together.)

Add flour mixture to wet mixture, and mix until well combined.

Grease and flour a non-stick tube cake pan (angel food cake pan, NOT Bundt). If the pan is not non-stick, line the bottom with parchment paper.

Fill pan about ¾ full.

Bake at 275 for 1 hour and 45 minutes to 2 hours.

Makes one large cake. If you want 2 smaller cakes, 8" or 9"cake pans can be used, but the cook time will need to be adjusted.



INGREDIENTS

2 cups of raisins

2 cups of currants (or chopped dried apricots)

1 1/2 cups of diced dates

Rum to cover fruit

1 cup dark brown Sugar

2 cups cold water

1 tsp vanilla

1 cup butter

1 tsp allspice

1 tsp ground cloves

1 tsp cinnamon

½ cup Captain Morgan or other Jamaican rum

3 cups flour

2 tsp baking powder

2 tsp baking soda

A Daidí na Nollag (Santa Claus)

D_ai_d_í n_a N_o_ll_a_g (D - as in English but with tongue pressed against back of upper teeth, ai - like I, d - as in English but with tongue pressed against back of upper teeth, í - as in cheer, n - as in onion, a - as in hat, N - as in English but with tongue pressed against back of upper teeth, o - as in bought, ll - as in English but with tongue pressed against back of upper teeth, a - as in fit, g - as in kin)

\$ geimhreadh (winter)

{This word is pronounced very differently than it looks to us, as native English speakers/readers} (g - as in give, ei - as in deck, mh - pronounced v, as in vet, r - as in tree, eadh - pronounced oo, as in too)

fear sneachta (snowman)

f_ea_r s_n_ea_ch_t_a (f - as in fit, ea - pronounced a, as in hat, r - as in foreign, but sounded more forcefully, s - pronounced sh, as in ship, n - as in onion, ea - pronounced a, as in hat, ch - as in lough, t - as in English but with tongue pressed against back of upper teeth, a - pronounced u, as in chute)

stocaí (stockings)

s_t_o_c_aí (s - as in sip, t - as in English but with tongue pressed against back of upper teeth, o - as in bought, c - hard c, as in cat, aí - pronounced u, as in chute)

crann péine (pine tree)

c_r_a_nn p_éi_n_e (c - hard c, as in cat, r - as in foreign, but sounded more forcefully, a - as in hat, nn - as in English, but with tongue pressed against back of upper teeth, p - as in pit, éi - as in Gael, n - as in need, e - pronounced i, as in fit).
