



# IRISH AMERICAN LITERARY REVIEW




#### THE MERMAIDS SINGING BY LISTA CAREY

I recently read another book set in Ireland. This one, *The Mermaids Singing*, by Lisa Carey, an American who lived in Ireland for 5 years, is set on a lonely island of the coast of Ireland: Inis Murúch, the Island of the Mermaids. The story explores the lives of three generations of women: Grace, her daughter Gráinne, and her mother Clione. Fifteen-year-old Gráinne is the main character, but we see a fair amount of Grace and Clione, so suppressed emotion, hidden feelings, and the tensions between mother and daughter are explored across all three generations.

Grace comes across as self-centered, and her actions as a teen come back to haunt Gráinne and Clione after her death (not a

spoiler... the death happens early and is a main point of the plot). There are some graphic sex scenes, but they are not gratuitous; instead, they help us see the long-term effects of first Grace's and later Gráinne's recklessness. The men, Seamus and Liam, while supporting characters in the book, come across as real. Carey's descriptions of Inish Murúch make the book worth reading.


